- Slide 5 Vialii Primrose in lower left, Candelabra Primrose, Alchemilla mollis (Lady's Mantle), Kirengeshoma Koreana
- Slide 6 Hakonechloa macra 'Aureola', Rodgersia 'Bronze Peacock' (Hakonechloa macra 'All Gold' loves sun)
- Slide 9 Smaller bulbs that naturalize – or spread on their own – work best, such as crocuses, daffodils, grape hyacinths and winter aconite.
- Slide 12 Trees with small leaves and open, layered canopies: Mountain Ash, Birch, Japanese Maple, Asian Dogwood, Witch Hazel.
- Slide 20 Hydrangea paniculata 'Limelight', Humulus lupulus aureus (Golden Hops), Purple Clematis on left post.
- Slide 26 Hardy Fuchsia, Hosta, Heuchera
- Slide 27 Astilbe, Brunnera, Pulmonaria, Lamium
- Slide 28 Astrantia, False Solomon's Seal, Fothergilla, Heuchera
- Slide 31 Alchemilla mollis, purple Clematis, variegated Hosta, pink Rose, Monarda

- Slide 41 Nandina 'Plum Passion', Nandina 'Moyer's Red', Salvia 'Hot Lips', Hebe 'Red Edge' (purple flowers), Dryopteris 'Autumn Fern' - young papery fronds that emerge a copper-red color, then mature to a deep green, apricot Begonia

- Slide 44 Purple Clematis, green and burgundy Heucheras, Hosta, False Solomon's Seal
